Job Overview

The Hospital Anesthesia / Recovery Technician is responsible for supporting veterinary surgeons to provide equine care in a variety of surgical procedures. The Hospital Anesthesia / Recovery Technician will report to the Hospital Technician Manager.

Responsibilities

- Provide perioperative care for surgical patients.
- Induce and maintain horses under anesthesia.
- Assist surgery technician to prepare suite for surgery, consisting of setting out appropriate instrumentation for surgery, prepare surgical scrub, assure table is properly installed for surgery
- Assist surgery technician to maintain surgical facilities to sterilization, radiation, OSHA, and environmental standards and ensures suite is stocked with necessary inventory & consumables
- Assist in pre-surgical workups, including diagnostic imaging, lameness exams, and internal medicine cases. This would include handling, lunging, and jogging horses, prepping joints, obtaining and downloading radiographs, etc.
- Assist in post-surgical care and treatments, including, but not limited to, preparing and administering medications, performing physical exams, placing catheters, running fluids, and assisting with diagnostics.
- Record & enter medical records, treatments, etc.
- Participate in the on-call rotation for primary and secondary on call technicians
- Additional responsibilities as needed

Qualifications

- Minimum one year working as a technician in an equine hospital or two years working as an (ambulatory) equine veterinary assistant. A strong preference is given to those with surgical experience
- Excellent horse-handling skills are mandatory, including handling of fractious horses, ability to jog horses in hand, and proficiency in lunging horses
- Exceptional time management, organization, and multitasking skills
- Quick-thinker, self-motivated, and a fast learner
- Ability to work with or around sick animals, potentially hazardous materials, cleaning chemicals, gas anesthetics, zoonotic diseases, and unpleasant odors
- Ability to communicate professionally and effectively at all times and maintains professionalism in emotionally charged / challenging situations.
- An outstanding team attitude, work ethic and an active participant in problem-solving and team advancement.

- Ability to work independently and practice good judgment to ensure high-quality care for all patients and request assistance when needed
- Capable of handling patient emergency situations
- Capable of heavy lifting, including hay bales, feed bags, and muck buckets

Special Considerations

Hours are Monday-Friday, 8a-4p or 10a-6p, with periodic overtime. Approximately one night on call each week is required. Benefits include attractive hourly pay commensurate with experience, 401K, health insurance, and discounted veterinary services and products.
